Beautiful Truth—Stewardship Sunday #2 Steward the Truth as Shared Humanity November 10, 2024

Today's Theme: Steward the Truth as Shared Humanity

Recognizing this shared humanity, and being able to evangelically discuss it, is critical to being a steward of the truth.


<u>The First Lesson:</u> **Hebrews 2:14-18-**-Christ has shared in our dying humanity to redeem us from the fear of death.

¹⁴ Since the children have flesh and blood, He too shared in their humanity so that by His death He might break the power of him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil— ¹⁵ and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death. ¹⁶ For surely it is not angels He helps, but Abraham's descendants. ¹⁷ For this reason He had to be made like them, fully human in every way, in order that He might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that He might make atonement for the sins of the people. ¹⁸ Because He Himself suffered when He was tempted, He is able to help those who are being tempted. (NIV 2011)

The Gospel Lesson: John 1:1-14—The Son of God became flesh and revealed the Father in grace and truth.

P: The Gospel according to Saint John, the first chapter.

C: Glory be to You, O Lord.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through Him all things were made; without Him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴ In Him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

- ⁶ There was a man sent from God whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. ⁸ He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.
- ⁹ The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and though the world was made through Him, the world did not recognize Him. ¹¹ He came to that which was His own, but His own did not receive Him. ¹² Yet to all who did receive Him, to those who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God— ¹³ children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.
