# God Comforts His People with His Forgiveness

#### **BEFORE WORSHIP**

**THEME FOR TODAY'S SERVICE:** Cleansed of sin the life of the believer is one of thanksgiving for deliverance now and into eternity.

#### HYMN CW 238 "Oh, Bless the Lord, My Soul"

(Christian hymns preach Jesus Christ: crucified, risen and seated at God's right hand.)

(The work of worship belongs to every Christian. Each of us stands as a priest before God.)

(The sign of the cross may be made by those present in remembrance of their Baptism.)

M: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: (spoken) Amen.

#### **CONFESSION OF SINS**

CONFESSION (1 John 1:8-9)

M: Have mercy on me, O God, according to Your steadfast love;

C: according to Your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.

M: Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity,

C: and cleanse me from my sin! Psalm 51:1, 2

M: Let us then confess our sins to God, our gracious Father.

M & C: Almighty God, merciful Father, we poor sinners beseech You to hear our words of repentance. We have sinned against You and have transgressed Your commands in thought, word, and deed. We have done the evil You forbid and have not done the good You demand. We do repent and are truly sorry for all of our sins, both known and unknown to us. Have mercy on us because of Jesus, our Savior. Grant that, by the working of the Holy Spirit, we may walk as Your forgiven and restored children here on earth until that time when we finally come into Your glorious heavenly presence.

ABSOLUTION (John 20:21-23)

("The use of the keys is that special power and right which Christ gave to His church on earth: to forgive the sins of the penitent sinners." Luther's Small Catechism: <u>The Use of the Keys and Confession.</u>)

M: God has promised His mercy and forgiveness to those who repent of their sins and turn to Him in repentance and humility. In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. May our merciful Lord keep you steadfast in the Holy Spirit, lead you to greater faith and obedience, and bring you to live with Him forever, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. **C: Amen.** 

KYRIE (Mark 10:47)

(These are the words to the oldest canticle in the Christian church, the Kyrie.)

M: In peace, let us pray to the Lord.

C: Lord, hear our prayer.

M: For the well-being of all people everywhere, that they may receive from You all they need to sustain body and life, hear our prayer, O Lord.

C: Lord, have mercy.

M. For the spread of Your life-giving gospel throughout the world, that all who are lost in sin may be brought to faith in You, hear our prayer, O Christ.

C: Christ, have mercy.

M: For patience and perseverance in this life, that we may not lose the hope of eternal life as we await Your return, hear our prayer, O Lord.

C: Lord, have mercy.

M. Lord of life, live in us that we may live for You.

C: Amen.

#### **SONG OF PRAISE**

M: In the peace of forgiveness, let us praise the Lord.

All glory be to God on high! Your name, O Lord, we glorify; We praise You for Your peace and grace, Your favor toward our fallen race.

Our grateful thanks to You we bring, For Your great glory, heav'nly King, For all, O Father, You have done Through Jesus Christ, Your only Son.

O Lamb of God, to You we pray. You take all human sin away. Have mercy, Lord; receive our prayer; From God's right hand, Your mercy share.

You, Christ, are holy—Lord alone; The Father's glory You made known. We by Your Spirit sing again: "All glory be to God!" Amen. (tune, CW 233)

### SALUTATION AND PRAYER OF THE DAY

(The salutation is a Christian greeting, offered here for mutual encouragement as the congregation prepares to hear God's word.)

M: The Lord be with you.C: And also with you.

M: O Lord Jesus, who came here on earth, calling people to repent—to have a change of mind--keep Your people from boasting about ourselves and our own deeds. Instead, constantly lead us to repentance, giving to us Your mind, so that in all things, we may boast about You and Your continual mercy; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen.

#### THE WORD

[We sit at the feet of Jesus like Mary did, to hear His word (Luke 10:42).]

**FIRST LESSON** 2 **TIMOTHY 2:8-13** (Paul urges Timothy to always remember the deliverance found in Jesus Christ. Because of this gospel message Paul is in chains. Yet it is this very message that gives him strength to remain and endure in anticipation of eternal glory. Paul quotes a hymn that reminds Christians that we will live with Christ and we will reign with Christ. That is the reason Paul can be thankful always—even in chains. That is the same hope that fills our lives with thanksgiving as we live for the Lord and await His reward.)

<sup>8</sup> Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, descended from David. This is my gospel, <sup>9</sup> for which I am suffering even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But God's word is not chained. <sup>10</sup> Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory.

If we died with Him,
we will also live with Him;

12 if we endure,
we will also reign with Him.

If we disown Him,
He will also disown us;

13 if we are faithless,
He remains faithful,
for He cannot disown Himself. (NIV 2011)

#### **VERSE OF THE DAY**

Alleluia. This is the Lord, we trusted in Him; let us rejoice and be glad in His salvation. Alleluia. (Isaiah 25:9b cf. NIV)

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>11</sup> Here is a trustworthy saying:

(The congregation stands and speaks words of acclamation out of respect for the words of Christ, our King.)

M: The gospel according to St. Luke, the 17th chapter.

C: Glory be to You, O Lord.

**GOSPEL LUKE 17:11-19** (Cries for mercy are answered by a heart filled with compassion. Those once separated by sickness are welcomed back. Yet only one returns to give thanks to his Savior for deliverance. Whether it's leprosy of the body or leprosy of the soul, Jesus has cleansed the afflicted. In His compassion for those diseased by sin, He has given His life to restore our membership in the family of our Father. By faith, our hearts are now moved to thankfulness for the healing hand of our gracious Lord. Our whole lives will be filled with thanksgiving.)

# After the Gospel:

M: This is the Gospel of the Lord.C: Praise be to You, O Christ.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>11</sup> Now on His way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. <sup>12</sup> As He was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met Him. They stood at a distance <sup>13</sup> and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!"

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>14</sup> When He saw them, He said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>15</sup> One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. <sup>16</sup> He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked Him—and he was a Samaritan.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>17</sup> Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? <sup>18</sup> Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" <sup>19</sup> Then He said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well." (NIV 2011)

# WORDS OF INSTITUTION


(1 Corinthians 11:23-25)

#### **AED Fundraiser**

Church council would like to purchase and install an "Automated External Defibrillator" or "AED". An AED is a computerized medical device used in the event someone is having a cardiac emergency. The device analyzes the heart rhythm, and delivers a defibrillating shock if necessary. You've probably seen these at stores and malls. Several members of our congregation underwent training on how to use this lifesaving device when they did CPR training for our Pre-School Accreditation. However, almost anyone can use it.

We will be holding a fundraiser to collect \$1359 to purchase this lifesaving device. Church council already re-designated \$136.11 we had left in the TV fund as seed money, leaving just over \$1200 remaining. We ask for your support. All donations can be added to the collection plate notated "AED Fund" in the memo.
